To designate one portion of Interstate Route 81 the "John Lewis Memorial Highway" and another portion of Interstate Route 81 the "Andrew Lewis Memorial Highway."

**11. Other comments:** The General Assembly or the Commonwealth Transportation Board has the statutory authority to name Highways and Bridges that form a part of the systems of State Highways.

John Lewis was the founder of the City of Staunton.

Andrew Lewis was the son of John Lewis. He was a member of the House of Burgesses. Also he was Commander and Chief of Virginia's Militia during the American Revolution 1776-1781.

The bill as written would differ from the Commonwealth Transportation Board's practice of requiring an affected locality or localities to pay for the fabrication and installation of signs for naming a highway or bridge.
