4. **Title** Hydraulic dredges

5. **Summary/Purpose:** The bill prohibits a person from taking or catching clams through the use of a hydraulic escalator dredge or having a hydraulic dredge designed for harvesting seafood on board a boat without a permit issued by the Marine Resources Commission unless they are traveling to or from docks for maintenance or repair or off-loading catches made in federal waters. The penalty for violation is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

7. **Budget amendment necessary:** No

8. **Fiscal implications:** Sentencing for a Class 1 misdemeanor could include jail time. There is not enough information available to reliably estimate how many convictions and prisoners in jail could result from the bill. Any increase in jail population will increase costs to the state. The Commonwealth pays the localities \$8 a day for each misdemeanant held in a jail, and the state also provides support for local jail operations. This support averaged \$30.54 per inmate each day in FY 1999.
