3. Committee Finance

4. Title Retirement System; retirees hired as teachers.

5. Summary/Purpose:

The substitute bill provides that retired members of the Virginia Retirement System may be hired as teachers without interrupting their retirement benefits if a critical shortage is declared by the Department of Education. The member must have a break in service that will not render the retirement benefits as an in service distribution under the Internal Revenue Code.
