4. Title Exemptions from licenses to hunt, trap, etc., by tribe members

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill provides that licenses to hunt, trap, or fish are not required of Indians who habitually reside on an Indian reservation, or who are members of the recognized tribes in the Commonwealth. Such persons, however, are required to have in their possession an identification card or paper signed by the chief of their tribe, a valid tribal identification card, written confirmation through a central tribal registry, or certification from a tribal office. Such cards, papers, confirmations, or certifications must set forth that the person named is an actual reservation resident or member of the recognized tribes and create a presumption of residence, which may be rebutted. Under current law, only those Indians residing on a reservation are exempt from the license requirements, provided that they have in their possession an identification card signed by the chief of their reservation.
