- **4. Title** Nontidal wetlands program
- 5. Summary/Purpose: The bill would eliminate any duplication of state and federal permitting requirements for those activities covered by a federal nationwide or regional permit. Once the State Programmatic General Permit is approved by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, only a state permit would be required for activities in nontidal wetlands and prior to that time, coverage under a federal nationwide permit would meet state permitting requirements. The bill reduces the time that the State Water Control Board has to seek the State Programmatic General Permit from July 1, 2002 to July 1, 2001, and would sunset the 2000 nontidal wetlands program legislation if State Programmatic General Permit approval is not obtained by January 1, 2003.
