11. Other comments: The General Assembly or the Commonwealth Transportation Board has the statutory authority to name Highways and Bridges that form a part of the systems of State Highways.

The \$400.00 cost to VDOT includes the fabrication and installation of two signs. This cost can be absorbed within VDOT's operating budget. The bill as written would differ from the Commonwealth

Transportation Board's practice of requiring an affected locality or localities to pay for the fabrication and installation of signs for naming a highway or bridge.

Mr. Willis was active in promoting the Smart Highway.

He was chairman of the Committee to promote a direct highway link between the Roanoke Valley and Virginia Tech.
