The bill would provide for the membership of the Board and its powers and duties.

8.	<b>Fiscal implications:</b> DPB is not able to estimate the potential fiscal impact associated with this legislation. However, the Virginia-Asian Advisory Board could be similar to the Virginia-Israel Advisory Board, which employs a full-time director. Chapter 1073, the 2000 Appropriation Act, includes \$150,000 in FY 2001 and \$130,000 in FY 2002 for the Virginia-Israel Advisory Board. While the bill requires that Board members be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses, there is no appropriation for the Virginia-Asian Advisory Board in Chapter 1073, the 2001 Introduced Budget Bill, or the House and Senate-passed amendments to the 2001 Introduced Budget Bill.
