4. **Title** Local Enforcement of the Fire Prevention Code

5. **Summary/Purpose:** The bill provides that if a local governing body elects to enforce only those provisions of the Fire Prevention Code related to open burning, it may do so in all or in any designated geographic areas of its jurisdiction. Current law allows for a local government to enforce only those provisions of the Fire Prevention Code related to open burning, but does not specify the enforcement of those provisions in designated areas of the local jurisdiction.
