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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 4.1-103 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 4.1-103. General powers of Board.
12	The Board shall have the power to:
14	1. Buy, import and sell alcoholic beverages other than beer and wine not produced by farm wineries,
15	and to have alcoholic beverages other than beer and wine not produced by farm wineries in its
16	possession for sale;
17	2. Buy and sell any mixers;
18	3. Control the possession, sale, transportation and delivery of alcoholic beverages;
19	4. Determine, subject to § 4.1-121, the localities within which government stores shall be established
20	or operated and the location of such stores;
21 22	5. Maintain warehouses for alcoholic beverages and control the storage and delivery of alcoholic beverages to and from such warehouses;
$\frac{22}{23}$	6. Lease, occupy and improve any land or building required for the purposes of this title;
24	7. Purchase or otherwise acquire title to any land or building required for the purposes of this title
25	and sell and convey the same by proper deed, with the consent of the Governor;
26	8. Purchase, lease or acquire the use of, by any manner, any plant or equipment which may be
27	considered necessary or useful in carrying into effect the purposes of this title, including rectifying,
28	blending and processing plants. The Board may purchase, build, lease, and operate distilleries and
29 30	manufacture alcoholic beverages;9. Determine the nature, form and capacity of all containers used for holding alcoholic beverages to
30 31	be kept or sold under this title, and prescribe the form and content of all labels and seals to be placed
32	thereon;
33	10. Appoint every agent and employee required for its operations; require any or all of them to give
34	bonds payable to the Commonwealth in such penalty as shall be fixed by the Board; and engage the
35	services of experts and professionals;
36	11. Hold and conduct hearings; issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses and the
37 38	production of records, memoranda, papers and other documents before the Board or any agent of the Board; and administer oaths and take testimony thereunder. The Board may authorize any Board
39	member or agent of the Board to hold and conduct hearings, issue subpoenas, administer oaths and take
40	testimony thereunder, and make summary decisions, subject to final decision by the Board, on
41	application of any party aggrieved. In addition, the Board may select, as it deems necessary, hearing
42	officers from the list maintained by the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court;
43	12. Make a reasonable charge for preparing and furnishing statistical information and compilations to
44	persons other than (i) officials, including court and police officials, of the Commonwealth and of its
45 46	subdivisions if the information requested is for official use and (ii) persons who have a personal or legal interest in obtaining the information requested if such information is not to be used for commercial or
47	trade purposes;
48	13. Promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.)
49	and § 4.1-111 of this chapter;
50	14. Grant, suspend, and revoke licenses for the manufacture, bottling, distribution, importation, and
51	sale of alcoholic beverages;
52 53	15. Assess and collect civil penalties and civil charges for violations of this title and Board
53 54	regulations; 16. Maintain actions to enjoin common nuisances as defined in § 4.1-317;
55	17. Establish minimum food sale requirements for all retail licensees; and
56	18. Do all acts necessary or advisable to carry out the purposes of this title.
