VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

An Act authorizing the issuance of Commonwealth of Virginia General Obligation Bonds in an amount not exceeding \$119,040,000 for the purpose of financing the cost of capital projects for parks and recreational facilities; authorizing the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor, to fix the details of such bonds and to provide for the sale of the bonds; authorizing the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor, to borrow money in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds; authorizing the issuance of refunding bonds, by and with the consent of the Governor; providing for the pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth for the payment of such obligations; providing that interest on such obligations shall be exempt from all taxation by the Commonwealth and any political subdivision thereof; and providing that this act shall not become effective and that no bonds shall be issued hereunder unless this act is approved by a majority of the qualified voters of the Commonwealth voting thereon at an election, as required by Article X, Section 9 (b) of the Constitution of Virginia.

Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. § 1. Title. *This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Commonwealth of Virginia Parks and Natural Areas Bond Act of 2002."*

§ 2. Authorization of Bonds and Bond Anticipation Notes (BANs). *The authorization to issue bonds hereunder is subject to a favorable vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on this act at the November 5, 2002, general election as hereinafter provided.*

Thereafter, the Treasury Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to sell and issue, at one time or from time to time, bonds of the Commonwealth, to be designated "Commonwealth of Virginia General Obligation Bonds, Series...," in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$119,040,000. The Treasury Board is further authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to borrow money in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds by the issuance of bond anticipation notes (BANs), including BANs issued as commercial paper.

§ 3. Purpose; Projects. *The proceeds of the bonds and BANs, excluding amounts needed to pay issuance costs and other financing expenses, shall be used as provided in § 4 hereof for capital projects for parks and recreational facilities as follows:*

241 *The General Assembly hereby finds and determines that the estimated useful life of the capital*
 242 *projects listed above is in excess of twenty-five years.*

243 *If any capital project relates to more than one state park or recreational facility, the Governor or his*
 244 *designee shall determine the amount to be allocated within such capital project to each such state park*
 245 *or recreational facility. To the extent that the cost of any capital project listed above is less than the*
 246 *amount allocated to such project, the Governor or his designee may increase the amount allocated to*
 247 *any other capital project listed above. No such allocation to a capital project may be increased,*
 248 *however, until it has been demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Governor or his designee that (a) the*
 249 *cost of the capital project has been reduced to the extent reasonable, (b) the capital project has not*
 250 *been expanded or enhanced beyond that originally approved, and (c) the capital project is suitable and*
 251 *adequate for the scope originally intended. No increase in the amount allocated to any capital project*
 252 *shall constitute an authorization for the issuance of bonds in an amount in excess of the aggregate*
 253 *amount authorized hereunder. No allocation shall be made to any capital project included herein until*
 254 *all applicable requirements of § 10.1-200.1 of the Code of Virginia have been met.*

255 *§ 4. Application of Proceeds. Proceeds (including any premium) of the bonds and any BANs (except*
 256 *the proceeds of (i) bonds the issuance of which has been anticipated by BANs, (ii) refunding bonds and*
 257 *(iii) refunding BANs) shall be deposited by the State Treasurer in a special capital outlay fund in the*
 258 *State Treasury and shall be disbursed only for the purpose for which the bonds or any BANs have been*
 259 *issued. In the event that the proceeds of the bonds or BANs exceed the cost of the projects specified in*
 260 *§ 3, the Treasury Board shall cause such excess proceeds to be applied to the retirement of the bonds*
 261 *or BANs. The proceeds of (i) bonds the issuance of which has been anticipated by BANs, (ii) refunding*
 262 *bonds and (iii) refunding BANs and any funds provided by the General Assembly, or available from any*
 263 *other source, for the purpose, shall be used to pay such BANs, refunded bonds and refunded BANs.*

264 *The proceeds of the bonds and any refunding bonds or BANs are hereby appropriated for*
 265 *disbursement from the state treasury for the current biennium pursuant to Article X, Section 7 of the*
 266 *Constitution of Virginia, and § 2.2-1819 of the Code of Virginia. The general conditions and general*
 267 *provisions of the general appropriation act enacted pursuant to Chapter 15 (§ 2.2-1500 et seq.) of Title*
 268 *2.2 of the Code of Virginia, in effect from time to time, and all of the terms and conditions contained*
 269 *therein shall apply to the capital projects listed in § 3. The Governor or his designee is hereby*
 270 *authorized to increase the appropriation for any project listed in § 3 by the amount of the proceeds of*
 271 *donations, gifts, grants or other nongeneral funds paid into the state treasury in excess of such*
 272 *appropriation.*

273 *§ 5. Details, sale of bonds and BANs. The bonds shall be dated, shall mature at such time or times*
 274 *not exceeding twenty-five years from their date or dates and may be made redeemable before their*
 275 *maturity or maturities at such price or prices or within such price parameters, all as may be determined*
 276 *by the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor. The principal of the bonds shall be*
 277 *amortized by payment into a sinking fund or otherwise, in annual installments. The first annual*
 278 *installment of principal of the bonds shall become due not later than one-tenth of the term of the bonds,*
 279 *and no installment of principal of the bonds shall be more than twice the smallest previous installment.*
 280 *Any such sinking fund shall not be appropriated for any other purpose.*

281 *The bonds shall be in such form, shall bear interest at such rate or rates, either at fixed rates or at*
 282 *rates established by formula or other method, and may contain such other provisions, all as the*

283 Treasury Board or the State Treasurer, when authorized by the Treasury Board, may determine. The
 284 principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the bonds and BANs shall be payable in lawful money
 285 of the United States of America. Bonds and BANs may be certificated or uncertificated as determined by
 286 the Treasury Board. The Treasury Board may contract for services of such registrars, transfer agents,
 287 or other authenticating agents as it deems appropriate to maintain a record of the persons entitled to
 288 the bonds and BANs. Bonds and BANs may be issued under a system of book entry for recording the
 289 ownership and transfer of ownership rights to receive payments on the bonds and BANs. The Treasury
 290 Board shall fix the denomination or denominations of the bonds and the place or places of payment of
 291 principal, premium, if any, and interest, which may be at the office of the State Treasurer or at any one
 292 or more banks or trust companies within or without the Commonwealth.

293 The Treasury Board may sell the bonds and any BANs in such manner, either by competitive
 294 bidding, negotiated sale or private placement, and for such price as it may determine, by and with
 295 consent of the Governor, to be in the interest of the Commonwealth.

296 At the discretion of the Treasury Board, bonds and BANs may be issued at one time or in part from
 297 time to time and may be issued and sold at the same time with other general obligation bonds and bond
 298 anticipation notes, respectively, of the Commonwealth authorized pursuant to Article X, Section 9(a)(3),
 299 (b) or (c) of the Constitution of Virginia, either as separate issues, as a combined issue designated
 300 "Commonwealth of Virginia General Obligation Bonds [Bond Anticipation Notes], Series 20....," or as a
 301 combination of both. The bonds and BANs shall be signed on behalf of the Commonwealth by the
 302 Governor and by the State Treasurer, or shall bear their facsimile signatures, and shall bear the lesser
 303 seal of the Commonwealth or a facsimile thereof. In the event that the bonds or BANs bear the facsimile
 304 signature of the State Treasurer, they shall be signed by such administrative assistant as the State
 305 Treasurer shall determine or by such registrar or paying agent as may be designated to sign them by
 306 the Treasury Board. If any officer whose signature or facsimile signature shall appear on any bonds or
 307 BANs shall cease to be such officer before the delivery, such signature or such facsimile shall
 308 nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes the same as if such officer had remained in office
 309 until such delivery, and any bond or BAN may bear the facsimile signature of, or may be signed by,
 310 such persons as at the actual time of the execution are the proper officers to sign such bond or BAN
 311 although, at the date of such bond or BAN, such persons may not have been such officers.

312 § 6. Refunding. The Treasury Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor,
 313 to sell and issue, at one time or from time to time, refunding bonds and BANs of the Commonwealth, to
 314 refund any or all of the bonds and BANs, respectively, issued under this act or otherwise pursuant to
 315 Article X, Section 9(b), of the Constitution of Virginia. Refunding bonds and BANs may be issued in a
 316 principal amount up to the amount necessary to pay at maturity or redeem the bonds and BANs to be
 317 refunded and pay all issuance costs and other financing expenses of the refunding. Such refunding
 318 bonds and BANs may be issued whether or not the bonds or BANs to be refunded are then subject to
 319 redemption. Any escrow or trust fund established with the proceeds from the sale of refunding bonds
 320 shall be irrevocably pledged to the payment of the bonds or BANs to be refunded, and shall be used
 321 solely to pay such bonds or BANs at maturity or upon redemption or for the purchase of not less than
 322 all of the bonds or BANs to be refunded. Any such escrow or trust fund shall constitute a special fund
 323 for the payment of such refunded bonds or BANs, and such refunded bonds or BANs, to the extent of
 324 amounts, including the maturity amounts of investments, set aside for the payment thereof in such
 325 escrow or trust fund, shall not be included for the purposes of determining any limitations upon the
 326 amount of bonded indebtedness of the Commonwealth that may be incurred pursuant to Article X,
 327 Section 9(b), of the Constitution of Virginia. The Treasury Board may, however, direct that the interest
 328 received from the investment of the proceeds of the bonds or BANs be transferred to the general fund of
 329 the State Treasury.

330 § 7. Authorized Investments. Pending the application of the proceeds of the bonds or BANs (including
 331 refunding bonds and BANs) to the purpose for which they have been authorized and the application of
 332 funds set aside for the purpose to the payment of bonds or BANs, they may be invested by the State
 333 Treasurer in securities that are legal investments under the laws of the Commonwealth for public funds
 334 and sinking funds, as the case may be. Whenever the State Treasurer receives interest from the
 335 investment of the proceeds of bonds or any BANs, such interest shall become a part of the principal of
 336 the bonds or any BANs and shall be used in the same manner as required for principal of the bonds or
 337 BANs. The Treasury Board may, however, direct that the interest received from the investment of the
 338 proceeds of the bonds or BANs be transferred to the general fund of the State Treasury.

339 § 8. Security for bonds and BANs. The full faith and credit of the Commonwealth is hereby
 340 irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and the interest on bonds, refunding bonds, and
 341 (unless the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor, shall provide otherwise) BANs
 342 issued under this act. The proceeds of (i) bonds the issuance of which has been anticipated by BANs,
 343 (ii) refunding bonds and (iii) refunding BANs are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of

principal of and interest and any premium on such bonds or BANs to be refunded thereby. In addition, the Treasury Board may pledge the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth for the payment of the principal of and interest on any BANs. If sufficient funds are not appropriated in the general appropriations act for any fiscal year for the timely payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds, any refunding bonds or any BANs where the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth has been pledged, there shall be set apart by direction of the Governor, from the first general fund revenues received during such fiscal year and thereafter, a sum sufficient to pay such principal and interest.

§ 9. Expenses. All expenses incurred under this act shall be paid from the proceeds of the bonds, or any refunding bonds or BANs, or from any other available funds as the Treasury Board shall determine.

§ 10. Exemption of interest from tax. The bonds and BANs issued under the provisions of this Act, their transfer, and the income therefrom, including any profit made on the sale thereof, shall at all times be exempt from taxation by the Commonwealth and by any political subdivision thereof. The interest on the bonds and any refunding bonds or BANs may be subject to inclusion in gross income of the holders thereof for federal income tax purposes.

§ 11. Referendum. The question of the effectiveness of this act and the authorization of the bonds shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Commonwealth at the general election to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2002. The referendum shall be supervised and held, notice thereof given, ballots prepared, returns made and certified, votes canvassed and results ascertained and made known, as provided by law. The ballots to be used at the election shall pose the question in substantially the following form:

QUESTION: Shall Chapter 884, Acts of the General Assembly of 2002, authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the maximum amount of \$119,040,000 pursuant to Article X, Section 9(b) of the Constitution of Virginia for capital projects for parks and recreational facilities, take effect?

After the general election, the State Board of Elections shall without delay make out, certify, and transmit to the Governor and to the Treasury Board an official copy of the report of the whole number of votes cast at the election for and against the act.

If a majority of those voting thereon shall vote in favor of this act, this act shall take effect and the bonds may be issued as hereinabove provided. If a majority of those voting thereon shall vote against this act, this act shall not take effect and the bonds shall not be issued.

The expenses incurred in conducting this election shall be defrayed as in the case of election of members of the General Assembly.

§ 12. Reimbursement. The Department of Conservation and Recreation may apply any available nongeneral funds to initiate a project authorized in § 3 hereof, and the appropriations provided for in this act may be used to reimburse the Department for nongeneral funds so applied. Such reimbursement shall be contingent upon the availability of appropriations provided for in this act. Reimbursement shall be made only for projects authorized in § 3 hereof which were supplemented with nongeneral funds on and after January 1, 2002, provided that any such expenditures have received the prior written approval of the Director of the Department of Planning and Budget.

§ 13. Severability. The provisions of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance that are held invalid shall not affect the validity of other provisions or applications of this act that can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications.

2. That on or before September 1, 2002, the Department of Conservation and Recreation shall provide to the Governor and the chairmen of the Senate Finance Committee and the House Appropriations Committee an implementation plan for the completion of the capital projects listed in the first enactment of this act. The plan shall include as a minimum: (i) the proposed construction schedule for each project indicating the anticipated start-up date for the project as well as the projected completion date for the project, taking into consideration the budgetary and programmatic capacity of the agency or institution to operate the completed capital project, (ii) detailed draw schedules indicating the monthly cash needs to finance expenditures from the start-up date to the completion date of each project, and (iii) an estimate of the additional costs for the staffing and equipping of each project as well as an identification of the anticipated source of funding to cover such additional costs for each project. The Governor shall prescribe a uniform format for the preparation of this submission.

3. That on or before January 15, 2003, the Governor shall release his proposed plan for the execution of the capital projects listed in the first enactment of this act. To the extent practicable, the Governor's plan shall be based on the implementation plans submitted by the Department of Conservation and Recreation pursuant to the second enactment of this act. However, the Governor shall modify such implementation plan, as necessary, to provide for the orderly issuance of the bonds authorized in this act and to ensure that the Commonwealth (i) stays within the appropriations in the general appropriation act to pay the debt service on such bonds, (ii) acts

405 within its budgetary ability to open and operate such completed capital projects, (iii) adheres to
406 the limits of its capacity to issue tax-supported debt, and (iv) complies with all other provisions of
407 law regarding its authority to issue debt.

408 Should the Governor find the need to make modification in any of the project schedules
409 proposed by the Department of Conservation and Recreation to meet the purposes stated herein,
410 he shall direct the Secretary of Finance to confer with the chairmen of the Senate Finance
411 Committee and the House Appropriations Committee and the Department of Conservation and
412 Recreation and develop criteria to determine which projects continue on schedule as planned and
413 which projects are deferred.

414 4. That commensurate with the release of the Governor's proposed plan for the execution of the
415 capital projects pursuant to the third enactment of this act, the Secretaries of Administration and
416 Finance shall jointly release recommendations to expedite the capital outlay review process as set
417 forth in § 2.2-1132 of the Code of Virginia. Such recommendations shall indicate whether they can
418 be implemented administratively or whether legislation will be necessary prior to their
419 implementation.

420 5. That the Secretary of Finance, in conjunction with the Secretaries of Natural Resources and
421 Administration, shall provide to the chairmen of the Senate Finance Committee and House
422 Appropriations Committee, beginning in 2003, by September 1 of each year, until such capital
423 projects as are herein authorized are completed, a status report on the projects, including (i) the
424 status of compliance with the expedited capital outlay review process as set forth in the fourth
425 enactment of this act and § 2.2-1132 of the Code of Virginia; and (ii) the most recent approved
426 draw schedules for the projects included in this act.

427 6. That there is hereby appropriated to the State Board of Elections from the general fund of the
428 state treasury an amount not to exceed \$125,000 for the costs of public notices and other
429 information required to be published in connection with the referendum on this act at the
430 November 5, 2002, general election.
