2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 15.2-2110 of the Code of Virginia, relating to mandatory connection to*
3 *water and sewage systems.*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 15.2-2110 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 15.2-2110. Mandatory connection to water and sewage systems in certain counties.

9 A. Botetourt, Cumberland, ~~and~~ Halifax, *and Nelson* Counties, and any county with a population
10 between 8,700 and 8,800, may require connection to their water and sewage systems by owners of
11 property that may be served by such systems; however, those persons having a domestic supply or
12 source of potable water and a system for the disposal of sewage adequate to prevent the contraction or
13 spread of infectious, contagious, and dangerous diseases shall not be required to discontinue use of the
14 same, but may be required to pay a connection fee, a front footage fee, and a monthly nonuser service
15 charge that shall not be more than that proportion of a minimum monthly user charge as debt service
16 compares to the total operating and debt service costs.

17 B. Goochland County and Rockingham County may require connection to their water and sewer
18 systems by owners of property that can be served by the systems if the property, at the time of
19 installation of such public system, or at a future time, does not have a then-existing, correctable, or
20 replaceable domestic supply or source of potable water and a then-existing, correctable, or replaceable
21 system for the disposal of sewage adequate to prevent the contraction or spread of infectious, contagious
22 and dangerous diseases. Such counties may not charge a fee for connection to its water and sewer
23 systems until such time as connection is required.

24 The provisions of this subsection as they apply to Goochland County shall become effective on July
25 1, 2002.

26 C. Buckingham County may require connection to its water and sewer systems by owners of property
27 that can be served by the systems if the property, at the time of installation of such public system, or at
28 a future time, does not have a then-existing or correctable domestic supply or source of potable water
29 and a then-existing or correctable system for the disposal of sewage adequate to prevent the contraction
30 or spread of infectious, contagious and dangerous diseases. Such county may not charge a fee for
31 connection to its water and sewer systems until such time as connection is required.
