2 An Act to amend and reenact § 59.1-148.3 of the Code of Virginia, relating to purchase of handguns of 3 certain officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6 7

1. That § 59.1-148.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 59.1-148.3. Purchase of handguns of certain officers.

9 A. The Department of State Police, the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, the Department of 10 Alcoholic Beverage Control, the Marine Resources Commission, the Capitol Police, any sheriff, any regional jail board or authority and any local police department may allow any full-time sworn 11 12 law-enforcement officer, deputy, or any former Superintendent of the Department of State Police who 13 leaves service after a minimum of five years or regional jail officer, a local fire department may allow 14 any full-time sworn fire marshal, the Department of Motor Vehicles may allow any law-enforcement 15 officer, and any institution of higher learning named in § 23-14 may allow any campus police officer appointed pursuant to Chapter 17 (§ 23-232 et seq.) of Title 23, retiring on or after July 1, 1991, who 16 17 retires after at least twenty years of service or as a result of a service-incurred disability to purchase the service handgun issued to him by the agency or institution at a price of one dollar. This privilege shall 18 19 also extend to any former Superintendent of the Department of State Police who leaves service after a 20 minimum of five years. Other weapons issued by the Department of State Police for personal duty use of 21 an officer, may, with approval of the Superintendent be sold to the officer subject to the qualifications 22 of this section at a fair market price determined as in subsection B, so long as the weapon is a type and 23 configuration that can be purchased at a regular hardware or sporting goods store by a private citizen 24 without restrictions other than the instant background check.

25 B. The agencies listed above may allow any full-time sworn law-enforcement officer who retires with 26 ten or more years of service, but less than twenty, to purchase the service handgun issued to him by the 27 agency at a price equivalent to the weapon's fair market value on the date of the officer's retirement. Any full-time sworn law-enforcement officer employed by any of the agencies listed above who is 28 29 retired for disability as a result of a nonservice-incurred disability may purchase the service handgun 30 issued to him by the agency at a price equivalent to the weapon's fair market value on the date of the 31 officer's retirement. Determinations of fair market value may be made by reference to a recognized 32 pricing guide.

33 C. The agencies listed above may allow the immediate survivor of any full-time sworn 34 law-enforcement officer (i) who is killed in the line of duty or (ii) who dies in service and has at least 35 twenty years of service to purchase the service handgun issued to the officer by the agency at a price of 36 one dollar.

37 D. The governing board of any institution of higher learning named in § 23-14 may allow any 38 campus police officer appointed pursuant to Chapter 17 (§ 23-232 et seq.) of Title 23 who retires on or 39 after July 1, 1991, to purchase the service handgun issued to him at a price equivalent to the weapon's 40 fair market value on the date of the officer's retirement. Determinations of fair market value may be 41 made by reference to a recognized pricing guide.

42 E. The Department of State Police may allow any full-time sworn state police law-enforcement 43 officer who retires as a result of a service-incurred disability and who was on disability leave at the time the Department issued 10-mm semiautomatic handguns to its officers to purchase one of the 10-mm 44 45 semiautomatic handguns used by the Department of State Police at a price of one dollar.

F. The Department of State Police may allow any officer who at the time of his retirement was a 46 full-time sworn law-enforcement officer and who retires after twenty years of state service, even if a 47 48 portion of his service was with another state agency, to purchase the service handgun issued to him by 49 the Department at a price of one dollar.

50 G. The sheriff of any county with a population between 63,000 and 65,000 may allow any auxiliary or volunteer deputy sheriff with a minimum of fifteen years of service, upon leaving office, to purchase 51 52 for one dollar the service handgun issued to him.
