6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 18.2-52.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to possession of biological
7	substances and radiological agents; penalties.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 18.2-52.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 18.2-52.1. Possession of infectious biological substances or radiological agents; penalties.
11	A. Any person who possesses, manufactures, sells, gives, distributes or uses, with the intent thereby
<b>12</b>	to injure another, an infectious biological substance or radiological agent, capable of causing death or
13	serious bodily injury, is guilty of a Class 5 felony.
14	B. Any person who destroys or damages, or attempts to destroy or damage, any facility, equipment
15	or material involved in the sale, manufacturing, storage or distribution of an infectious biological
16	substance or radiological agent, capable of causing death, with the intent to injure another by releasing
17	the substance, is guilty of a Class 4 felony.
18	An "infectious biological substance" includes any bacteria, virusviruses, fungi, protozoa, or rickettsiae
19	capable of causing death or serious bodily injury.
20	A "radiological agent" includes any substance able to release radiation at levels that are capable of
21	causing death or serious bodily injury.
22	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
23	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation is
24	for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and for
25	periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.
