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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 121 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by House Committee on Militia, Police and Public Safety

on February 1, 2002)

34 56 7 Requesting the Department of Juvenile Justice to design and implement a uniform mental health screening instrument and interview process for juvenile offenders admitted to secure detention 8 facilities and to make recommendations concerning the feasibility of implementing a uniform 9 screening and interview process for pre-dispositional investigations.

WHEREAS, the Committee Studying Treatment Options for Offenders with Mental Illness or 10 Substance Abuse Disorders (SJR 440, 2001) found that local detention homes and court service units do 11 not conduct uniform screenings and assessments for mental illness among juvenile offenders; and 12

WHEREAS, consistent with § 16.1-248.2 of the Code of Virginia, the Department of Juvenile Justice 13 14 regulations require that staff at each secure detention facility "ascertain the resident's need for a mental health assessment and if staff determine that a mental health assessment is needed, it shall take place 15 16 within 24 hours of such determination"; and

WHEREAS, Department regulations do not provide basic guidelines for conducting screenings or 17 18 assessments: and

19 WHEREAS, of the detention homes that responded to a questionnaire from the Committee Studying 20 Treatment Options for Offenders with Mental Illness or Substance Abuse Disorders, less than 40 percent 21 use a standardized mental health assessment instrument; and

22 WHEREAS, uniform screening and assessment methods conducted by qualified individuals can aide 23 in identification and treatment of mental illness and help eliminate a cycle of recidivism; and

24 WHEREAS, the Committee Studying Treatment Options for Offenders with Mental Illness or 25 Substance Abuse Disorders recommended that the Department of Juvenile Justice design and implement a uniform mental health screening and assessment instrument and interview process for juveniles 26 27 identified by probation officers as needing a mental health screening; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the Department of Juvenile 28 29 Justice be requested to design and implement a uniform mental health screening instrument and 30 interview process for juvenile offenders admitted to secure detention facilities and to make recommendations concerning the feasibility of implementing a uniform screening and interview process 31 32 for pre-dispositional investigations. The Department's recommendations shall include the fiscal and 33 related impacts of implementing the uniform mental health screening instrument and interview process 34 among probation officers conducting pre-dispositional investigations pursuant to § 16.1-273 of the Code of Virginia. The Department of Juvenile Justice shall report its findings and recommendations to the 35 36 Committee Studying Treatment Options for Offenders with Mental Illness or Substance Abuse Disorders 37 by September 30, 2002.

38 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Juvenile Justice, 39 upon request.

40 The Department of Juvenile Justice shall complete its work by November 30, 2002, and shall submit 41 its written findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 2003 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the 42 processing of legislative documents. 43

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
