7 WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, terrorists launched an inexcusable attack on the United States,8 causing great destruction and horrible human suffering in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania; and

9 WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of10 the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

11 WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was James Lynch of Manassas, a civilian
 12 Naval employee in the Pentagon and an Air Force veteran; and

WHEREAS, James Lynch was known in the Manassas neighborhood where he lived with his wife
and children as a dependable, friendly, helpful neighbor who tended to his rose and flower gardens and
was a member of a motorcycle club called the Virginia Fours; now, therefore, be it
