HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 341

Celebrating the life of James Lynch.

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, terrorists launched a violent attack on the United States, causing great destruction and horrible human suffering in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was James Lynch of Manassas, a civilian naval employee in the Pentagon and an Air Force veteran; and

WHEREAS, James Lynch was known in the Manassas neighborhood where he lived with his wife and children as a dependable, friendly, helpful neighbor who tended to his rose and flower gardens and was a member of a motorcycle club called the Virginia Fours; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly note with sadness the loss of James Lynch, an innocent victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks on the United States; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the family of James Lynch as an expression of the heartfelt condolences of the General Assembly of Virginia.
