8 WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of 9 the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

10 WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was John J. Chada of Manassas, an 11 administrative assistant for the Department of Defense Information Management Support Center; and

WHEREAS, retired from the United States Army, John Chada served two tours of duty in Vietnam, 12 13 and during his long military career served in both the United States Army and the United States Navy; 14 and

15 WHEREAS, a devoted family man, John Chada was a longtime member of the Moose Lodge in 16 Manassas, which he served as president, governor, junior governor, and many other offices; and

17 WHEREAS, a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, John Chada was a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and was a member of the American Legion; now, therefore, be it 18
