7 WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, terrorists launched an inexcusable attack on the United States,8 causing great destruction and horrible human suffering in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania; and

9 WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of 10 the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

11 WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was Sandra White of Prince William County,12 an Army civilian employee at the Pentagon; and

WHEREAS, for 18 years the wife of retired Army officer Oscar White, Sandra White was thedevoted mother of two sons, Oscar, 17, and Jonathan, 15; and

WHEREAS, Sandra White and her close-knit family regularly attended First Mount Zion BaptistChurch in Dumfries; now, therefore, be it

22 General Assembly of Virginia.
