WHERÊAŠ, a native of Austin, Texas, and a graduate of the University of Texas, Robert Maxwell,
married and the father of Tanner R. Maxwell, had worked at the Pentagon for 29 years and was known
for his dedication to his career; now, therefore, be it

 sadness the loss of Robert James Maxwell, an innocent victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks on
 the United States; and, be it
