5	certification and supervision of bail bondsmen should be shifted from the judicial branch to the

11	WHEREAS, Virginia Code § 19.2-152.1 vests with circuit court judges the responsibility for the
12	certification of bail bondsmen, but does not specify any means or standards for an investigation prior to
13	certification, other than simply a review of the record of the applicant furnished by the Federal Bureau
14 15	of Investigation and a review of the applicant's past conduct in that circuit court; and WHEREAS, the dispersal of certification responsibility among the respective circuit court judges
15 16	impedes the development of statewide standards of and procedures for the certification of bail bondsmen
17	beyond the threshold financial criteria specified in Virginia Code § 19.2-152.1; and
18	WHEREAS, because Virginia Code § 19.2-152.1 provides that every bail bondsman "shall be subject
19	to and governed by any reasonable rules of conduct or procedure set up by the judge of the court in
20	which he is acting as a bondsman," a bail bondsman who operates in a number of jurisdictions is likely
21	to be subject to differing local rules; and
22 23	WHEREAS, because Virginia Code § 19.2-152.1 does not provide a mechanism for the investigation or prosecution of complaints against bail bondsmen by a nonjudicial officer for the violation of the
23 24	various local rules of conduct or procedure, the respective circuit court judges are implicitly left with
25	both an investigative role and a prosecutorial role for such proceedings, in addition to their adjudicative
26	role; and
27	WHEREAS, the current statutory framework does not promote statewide uniformity in the
28	certification, conduct and regulation of bail bondsmen and places circuit court judges in multiple,
29	potentially conflicting roles; now, therefore, be it
30 31	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Criminal
31 32	Justice Services be requested to study whether the responsibility for the certification and supervision of bail bondsmen should be shifted from the judicial branch to the executive branch of state government.
33	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department for this study, upon
34	request.
35	The Department shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
36	Governor and the 2003 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division
37	of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
