9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 46.2-921.1 as follows:
11	§ 46.2-921.1. Drivers to yield right-of-way or reduce speed when approaching stationary emergency
12	vehicles on highways; penalties.
13	The driver of any motor vehicle, upon approaching a stationary emergency vehicle, as defined in
14	§ 46.2-920, that is displaying a flashing, blinking, or alternating emergency light or lights as provided
15	in §§ 46.2-1022, 46.2-1023, and 46.2-1024, shall (i) on a highway having at least four lanes, at least
16	two of which are intended for traffic proceeding as the approaching vehicle, proceed with caution and,
17	if possible, with due regard for safety and traffic conditions, yield the right-of-way by making a lane
18	change into a lane not adjacent to that occupied by the stationary emergency vehicle or (ii) if changing
19	lanes would be impossible or unsafe, proceed with due caution, reduce speed and maintain a safe speed
20	for highway conditions.
21	Violation of any provision of this section shall constitute a [Class 1] misdemeanor [punishable by
22	a fine of no more than \$10,000 ]. If the violation resulted in damage to property of another person, the
23	court [ shall may ], in addition, order the suspension of the driver's privilege to operate a motor
24	vehicle for not less than 90 days nor more than one year. If the violation resulted in injury to another
25	person, the court [ shall may ], in addition to any other penalty imposed, order the suspension of the
26	driver's privilege to operate a motor vehicle for not less than 180 days nor more than two years. If the
27	violation resulted in the death of another person the court [shall may] in addition to any other

violation resulted in the death of another person, the court [ shall may ], in addition to any other penalty imposed, order the suspension of the driver's privilege to operate a motor vehicle for two years. 27 28
