5 6	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Hawkins) A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.4, consisting of
7	sections numbered 62.1-69.34 through 62.1-69.42, relating to the establishment of the Roanoke River
8	Basin Bi-State Commission.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.4,
11	consisting of sections numbered 62.1-69.34 through 62.1-69.42, as follows:
12 13	CHAPTER 5.4. ROANOKE RIVER BASIN BI-STATE COMMISSION.
13 14	§ 62.1-69.34. Definitions.
15	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
16	"Basin" means the Roanoke River Basin.
17	"Roanoke River Basin" means that land area designated as the Roanoke River Basin by the State
18	Water Control Board pursuant to § 62.1-44.38 of the Code of Virginia and the North Carolina
19 20	Department of Environment and Natural Resources.
20 21	§ 62.1-69.35. Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission established; purpose. The Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission is hereby established as a bi-state commission
22	composed of members from Virginia and North Carolina and hereinafter referred to as the Commission.
$\frac{1}{23}$	The Commission shall:
24	1. Provide guidance, conduct joint meetings, and make recommendations to local, state and federal
25	legislative and administrative bodies, and to others, as it deems necessary and appropriate, for the use,
26	stewardship and enhancement of the water and other natural resources;
27 28	2. Provide a forum for discussion of issues affecting the Basin's water quantity, water quality and other natural resources;
2 9	<i>3. Promote communication, coordination and education among stakeholders within the Basin;</i>
30	4. Identify Basin-related problems and recommend appropriate solutions; and
31	5. Undertake studies and prepare, publish and disseminate information through reports, and in other
32	forms, related to water quantity, water quality and other natural resources of the Basin.
33 34	§ 62.1-69.36. Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission powers. A. The Commission shall have no regulatory powers.
35	B. To carry out its purposes, the Commission shall have the power to:
36	1. Enter into contracts and execute all instruments necessary or appropriate;
37	2. Perform any lawful acts necessary or appropriate;
38	3. Establish a nonprofit corporation as an instrumentality to assist in the details of administering its
39 40	affairs and in raising funds;
40 41	4. Seek, apply for, accept and expend gifts, grants and donations, services and other aids from public or private sources. Other than those from planning district commissions and those appropriated by the
42	General Assemblies of Virginia and North Carolina, funds may be accepted by the Commission only
43	following such procedures as may be established by the Commission for the conduct of its business;
44	5. Establish standing and ad hoc advisory committees, which shall be constituted so as to ensure a
45	balance of recognized interests. The purpose of each advisory committee shall be determined by the
46 47	Commission; and
4 7 48	6. Develop rules and procedures for the conduct of its business or as are necessary to carry out its purposes, including, but not limited to, selecting a chairman and vice-chairman, rotating chairmanships,
49	calling meetings and establishing voting procedures. Rules and procedures developed pursuant to this
50	subdivision shall be effective upon an affirmative vote by a majority of the Commission members.
51	§ 62.1-69.37. Membership; terms of office; eligibility for appointment.
52 53	A. The Commission shall be composed of eighteen voting members with each state making nine
53 54	appointments. The Virginia citizen members shall be appointed in the following manner: one member shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; two members shall be
54 55	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; one member shall be appointed by the Governor;
56	and five voting members of the Virginia Roanoke River Basin Commission, as established by the Code
57	of Virginia, shall be selected by the voting members of that Commission. The North Carolina citizen
58	members shall be appointed in the following manner: three members shall be appointed by the
59	Governor; three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and three

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60 members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

B. Each of the eighteen appointees shall: 61

62 1. Reside within the Basin's watershed;

63 2. Have demonstrated an interest in, experience with, or expertise in water-related Basin issues; and

64 3. Represent one of the following: holders of local, state or federal water permits; Basin interest 65 groups; public officials or governmental entities; agricultural organizations or associations; forestry 66 organizations or associations; soil and water conservation districts; and recreational use organizations 67 or associations.

68 C. The terms of office for each appointed citizen member shall be two years. No member shall serve more than three consecutive terms. To be eligible for reappointment, a member shall have attended at 69 70 least one-half of all meetings of the Commission during his current term of service. Appointments to fill 71 vacancies shall be made for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the 72 original selection.

73 D. Members of the Virginia Senate and Virginia House of Delegates and the North Carolina House 74 of Representatives and Senate and federal legislators whose districts include any portion of the Basin 75 may serve as nonvoting ex-officio members of the Commission. Their terms of office shall be coincident 76 with their terms of public office.

77 E. Members of the Commission representing each state may meet separately to discuss Basin-related 78 issues affecting their state. 79

§ 62.1-69.38. Standing and ad hoc committees.

80 To facilitate communication among stakeholders in the Roanoke River Basin, and to maximize participation by all interested parties, the Commission shall establish both standing and ad hoc 81 committees. The voting members of the Commission shall make the appointments to each committee. The 82 83 standing committees shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

84 1. Permit holders. The Commission shall identify those entities that hold permits issued by a federal, 85 state or local regulatory agency pertaining to the water of the Basin. The entities so identified may 86 appoint a representative to this committee in accordance with guidelines adopted by the Commission;

87 2. Roanoke River Basin interest groups. The Commission shall identify those interest groups that 88 shall be entitled to appoint a representative to this committee in accordance with guidelines adopted by 89 the Commission:

90 3. Public officials and government entities. This committee shall be composed of both U.S. Senators 91 from Virginia and North Carolina, or their designees, and any member of the U.S. House of 92 Representatives from Virginia or North Carolina, or his designee, whose district includes any portion of the Basin. Each county, city and town located completely or partially within the Basin and any other governmental entities the Commission deems appropriate shall be entitled to appoint one member to this 93 94 committee in accordance with guidelines adopted by the Commission; and 95

96 4. Agriculture, forestry, and soil and water conservation districts. The Commission shall identify persons who represent agricultural and forestry interests throughout the Basin and representatives from 97 98 the soil and water conservation districts within the Basin. The Commission shall make appointments 99 from such groups in accordance with guidelines adopted by the Commission. 100

§ 62.1-69.39. Staffing and support.

The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality and the North Carolina Department of 101 102 Environment and Natural Resources shall provide staff support to the Commission. Additional staff may be hired or contracted for by the Commission through funds raised by or provided to it. The 103 Commission is authorized to determine the duties of such staff and fix staff compensation within 104 105 available resources.

106 All agencies of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of North Carolina shall cooperate with 107 the Commission and, upon request, shall assist the Commission in fulfilling its responsibilities. The 108 Virginia Secretary of Natural Resources and the North Carolina Secretary of the Department of 109 Environment and Natural Resources, or their designees, shall act as the chief liaison between the state 110 agencies and the Commission. 111

§ 62.1-69.40. Funding.

112 A. The Commission shall annually adopt a budget, which shall include the Commission's estimated 113 expenses. The funding of the Commission shall be the shared responsibility of Virginia and North 114 Carolina. Each state's contribution shall be set through the normal state appropriations processes. The Virginia planning district commissions within the Basin shall share Virginia's portion of the expenses, 115 116 which can be in the form of in-kind contributions. 117

B. The Commission shall designate a fiscal agent.

118 C. The accounts and records of the Commission showing the receipt and disbursement of funds from 119 whatever source derived shall be in such form as the Virginia Auditor of Public Accounts and the North 120 Carolina State Auditor prescribe, provided that such accounts shall correspond as nearly as possible to the accounts and records for such matters maintained by similar enterprises. The accounts and records 121

122 of the Commission shall be subject to an annual audit by the Virginia Auditor of Public Accounts and

the North Carolina State Auditor or their legal representatives, and the costs of such audit services shall
be borne by the Commission. The results of the audits shall be delivered to the Virginia Senate
Committee on Finance and the Virginia House Committee on Appropriations and the appropriate
legislative oversight committees in North Carolina.

- 127 § 62.1-69.41. Compensation and expenses of Commission members.
- **128** A. The Virginia members of the Commission shall receive compensation and expenses as follows:
- 129 1. Ex-officio legislative members who are members of the General Assembly at the rate established
- 130 in § 30-19.12 of the Code of Virginia; and
- 131 2. All other members of the Commission at the rate established in § 2.2-2813.

B. The North Carolina members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel
 expenses as follows:

- 134 1. Ex-officio legislative members who are members of the General Assembly at the rate established 135 in North Carolina G.S. 138-6;
- 136 2. Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or of local government agencies137 at the rate established in North Carolina G.S. 138-6; and
- **138** *3.* All other members at the rate established in North Carolina G.S. 138-5.
- **139** § 62.1-69.42. Annual report required.
- 140 The Commission shall make an annual report, including any recommendations, to the Governors and
- **141** General Assemblies of Virginia and North Carolina.
- 142 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective January 1, 2003, or upon enactment by the
- 143 State of North Carolina of a similar act, whichever occurs last.
