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## **SENATE BILL NO. 460**

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the Governor on April 8, 2002)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Hawkins)

- 4 5 6 7 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.4, consisting of sections numbered 62.1-69.34 and 62.1-69.35, relating to the Virginia Roanoke River Basin Advisory Committee, and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.5, consisting of sections numbered 62.1-69.36 through 62.1-69.44, relating to the Roanoke River Basin 8 9 10 Bi-State Commission.
- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 11

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.4, 12 consisting of sections numbered 62.1-69.34 and 62.1-69.35, and that the Code of Virginia is 13 amended by adding in Title 62.1 a chapter numbered 5.5, consisting of sections numbered 14 15 62.1-69.36 through 62.1-69.44, as follows:

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CHAPTER 5.4. VIRGINIA ROANOKE RIVER BASIN ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

§ 62.1-69.34. Virginia Roanoke River Basin Advisory Committee established; membership; terms of 18 office. 19

20 A. The Virginia Roanoke River Basin Advisory Committee is hereby established as an advisory 21 committee to the Virginia delegation to the Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission, to assist the 22 delegation in fulfilling the duties and carrying out the objectives of the Commission, pursuant to 23 § 62.1-69.35. The advisory committee shall be composed of eighteen members to be appointed as 24 follows: two members of the Senate, whose districts include a part of the Virginia portion of the 25 Roanoke River Basin, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; four members of the House of Delegates, whose districts include a part of the Virginia portion of the 26 27 Roanoke River Basin, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House, in accordance with the principles of 28 proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; the Virginia member of 29 the U.S. House of Representatives, whose district includes the largest portion of the Basin, or his 30 designee, if he elects to serve on the advisory committee; ten members selected by the legislative 31 members of the advisory committee such that two are chosen from recommendations of each of the 32 following: the Central Virginia Planning District Commission, the West Piedmont Planning District 33 Commission, the Southside Planning District Commission, the Piedmont Planning District Commission, 34 and the Roanoke Valley Alleghany Planning District Commission; and one member selected by the 35 legislative members of the advisory committee from among recommendations submitted by the New River 36 Valley Planning District Commission. Of the recommendations submitted by planning district 37 commissions authorized to recommend two members, one member shall be a citizen who resides within 38 the respective planning district. However, the New River Valley Planning District Commission may 39 recommend either a citizen at-large who resides within the planning district or a member, who at the 40 time of the recommendation, is serving as an elected member or an employee of a local governing body, 41 or a member of the board of directors or an employee of the planning district commission. All persons 42 recommended by the planning district commissions to serve as members of the advisory committee shall reside within the Basin's watershed, represent the diversity of interests in the jurisdictions comprising 43 the respective planning district commissions, and demonstrate interest, experience, or expertise in 44 45 water-related Basin issues. In addition, persons representing the interests of the State of North Carolina who may be appointed to the advisory committee shall serve as non-voting ex officio members. 46 47

The advisory committee shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from among its members.

**48** B. State and federal legislative members appointed to the advisory committee shall serve terms 49 coincident with their terms of office. Members recommended by planning district commissions to serve on the advisory committee and ex officio members representing the State of North Carolina shall serve a 50 51 term of two years. Initially, planning district commissions authorized to recommend two members to the advisory committee shall recommend one member for a term of two years and one member for a term of 52 53 one year. However, the member recommended to serve on the advisory committee by the New River 54 Valley Planning District Commission shall serve a term of one year. Thereafter, the term of office of members recommended by planning district commissions shall be for two years. Members recommended 55 by planning district commissions shall be eligible for reappointment, if such members shall have attended at least one-half of all meetings of the Commission during their current term of service. 56 57 However, no member recommended by a planning district commission shall serve more than three 58 59 consecutive two-year terms. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be made for the unexpired terms.

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60 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

§ 62.1-69.35. Compensation and expenses of advisory committee members. 61

62 Legislative members of the advisory committee shall receive such compensation as provided in 63 § 30-19.12, and shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance 64 of their duties as provided in § 2.2-2825.§

## CHAPTER 5.5.

## ROANOKE RIVER BASIN BI-STATE COMMISSION.

67 § 62.1-69.36. Definitions.

68 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:

69 "Basin" means the Roanoke River Basin.

"Roanoke River Basin" means that land area designated as the Roanoke River Basin by the Virginia 70 71 State Water Control Board, pursuant to § 62.1-44.38, and the North Carolina Department of 72 Environment and Natural Resources.

§ 62.1-69.37. Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission established; purpose.

74 The Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission is hereby established as a bi-state commission 75 composed of members from the Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of North Carolina and 76 hereinafter referred to as the Commission. The Commission shall:

1. Provide guidance, conduct joint meetings, and make recommendations to local, state and federal 77 78 legislative and administrative bodies, and to others as it deems necessary and appropriate, regarding 79 the use, stewardship, and enhancement of the Basin's water and other natural resources;

2. Provide a forum for discussion of issues affecting the Basin's water quantity, water quality, and 80 81 other natural resources;

82 3. Promote communication, coordination and education among stakeholders within the Basin;

83 4. Identify Basin-related problems and recommend appropriate solutions; and

84 5. Undertake studies and prepare, publish, and disseminate information through reports, and other 85 communications, related to water quantity, water quality and other natural resources of the Basin.

§ 62.1-69.38. Membership; terms of office; eligibility for appointment.

87 A. The Commission shall be composed of eighteen voting members with each state appointing nine members. The Virginia delegation shall consist of the six state legislative members appointed to the 88 89 Virginia Roanoke River Basin Advisory Committee by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections 90 and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, and three nonlegislative members of the Virginia Roanoke 91 River Basin Advisory Committee, who represent different geographical areas of the Virginia portion of the Roanoke River Basin, to be appointed by the Governor of Virginia. The North Carolina delegation 92 to the Commission shall be appointed as determined by the State of North Carolina. All members appointed to the Commission by the Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of North Carolina shall reside within the Basin's watershed. Members of the Virginia House of Delegates and the Senate of 93 94 95 Virginia, the North Carolina House of Representatives and Senate, and federal legislators, who have not 96 97 been appointed to the Commission and whose districts include any portion of the Basin, may serve as 98 nonvoting ex officio members of the Commission.

99 B. The terms of office for appointed members shall be two years, unless the member is reappointed 100 by the appointing authorities of each state. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be made for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. State and 101 102 federal legislators and local government officials, whether appointed or ex officio, shall serve terms 103 coincident with their terms of office.

104 C. Each state's delegation to the Commission may meet separately to discuss Basin-related issues affecting their state, and may report their findings independently of the Commission. 105

§ 62.1-69.39. Roanoke River Basin Bi-State Commission powers and duties. 106 107

A. The Commission shall have no regulatory authority.

108 B. To perform its duties and objectives, the Commission shall have the power to:

109 1. Develop rules and procedures for the conduct of its business or as may be necessary to perform 110 its duties and carry out its objectives, including, but not limited to, selecting a chairman and vice-chairman, rotating chairmanships, calling meetings and establishing voting procedures. Rules and 111 112 procedures developed pursuant to this subdivision shall be effective upon an affirmative vote by a 113 majority of the Commission members:

114 2. Establish standing and ad hoc advisory committees, which shall be constituted in a manner to 115 ensure a balance between recognized interests. The purpose of each advisory committee shall be 116 determined by the Commission;

3. Seek, apply for, accept and expend gifts, grants and donations, services and other aid from public 117 or private sources. With the exception of funds provided by the planning district commissions and funds 118 119 appropriated by the General Assemblies of Virginia and North Carolina, the Commission may accept 120 funds only after an affirmative vote by a majority of the members of the Commission or by following such other procedures as may be established by the Commission for the conduct of its business; 121

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122 4. Establish a nonprofit corporation to assist in the details of administering its affairs and in raising 123 funds;

124 5. Enter into contracts and execute all instruments necessary or appropriate; and

125 6. Perform any lawful acts necessary or appropriate for the furtherance of its work.

126 § 62.1-69.40. Standing and ad hoc committees.

127 To facilitate communication among stakeholders in the Roanoke River Basin, and to maximize 128 participation by all interested parties, the Commission shall establish both standing and ad hoc 129 committees. The Commission shall appoint the members of the standing and ad hoc committees, in 130 accordance with guidelines adopted by the Commission. The standing committees shall include, but not 131 be limited to, the following:

132 1. Permit holders. The Commission shall identify those entities that hold permits issued by a federal, 133 state or local regulatory agency pertaining to the water of the Basin. Such entities may recommend a 134 representative to be appointed to the committee by the Commission;

135 2. Roanoke River Basin interest groups. The Commission shall identify interest groups that may 136 recommend a representative to be appointed to the committee by the Commission;

3. Public officials and government entities. The committee shall be composed of representatives of 137 138 each county, city and town located completely or partially within the Basin, and any other governmental 139 entities that the Commission deems appropriate may recommend one member to be appointed to the 140 committee by the Commission. The committee may also include the U.S. Senators from Virginia and 141 North Carolina or their designees, and any member of the U.S. House of Representatives or his 142 designee, whose district includes any portion of the Basin, if such members elect to serve on the 143 committee; and

144 4. Agriculture, forestry and soil and water conservation districts. The Commission shall identify 145 persons who represent agricultural and forestry interests throughout the Basin and representatives from 146 the soil and water conservation districts within the Basin and shall appoint representatives from these 147 groups to the committee.

§ 62.1-69.41. Staffing and support. 148

149 The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality and the North Carolina Department of 150 Environment and Natural Resources shall provide staff support to the Commission. Additional staff may 151 be hired or contracted by the Commission through funds raised by or provided to it. The duties and 152 compensation of such additional staff shall be determined and fixed by the Commission, within available 153 resources.

154 All agencies of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of North Carolina shall cooperate with 155 the Commission and, upon request, shall assist the Commission in fulfilling its responsibilities. The 156 Virginia Secretary of Natural Resources and the North Carolina Secretary of the Department of 157 Environment and Natural Resources or their designees shall each serve as the liaison between their 158 respective state agencies and the Commission.

159 § 62.1-69.42. Funding.

160 A. The Commission shall annually adopt a budget, which shall include the Commission's estimated expenses. Funding for the Commission shall be shared and apportioned between the Commonwealth of 161 162 Virginia and the State of North Carolina. The appropriation of public funds to the Commission shall be provided through each state's regular process for appropriating public funds. The Virginia planning 163 district commissions within the Basin shall bear a proportion of Virginia's share of the expenses, which 164 165 may be in the form of in-kind contributions.

166 B. The Commission shall designate a fiscal agent.

167 C. The accounts and records of the Commission showing the receipt and disbursement of funds from 168 whatever source derived shall be in such form as the Virginia Auditor of Public Accounts and the North Carolina State Auditor prescribe, provided that such accounts shall correspond as nearly as possible to 169 170 the accounts and records for such matters maintained by similar enterprises. The accounts and records 171 of the Commission shall be subject to an annual audit by the Virginia Auditor of Public Accounts and 172 the North Carolina State Auditor or their legal representatives, and the costs of such audit services shall 173 be borne by the Commission. The results of the audits shall be delivered to the appropriate legislative 174 oversight committees in each state. 175

§ 62.1-69.43. Compensation and expenses of Commission members.

176 A. Legislative members of the Virginia delegation to the Commission shall receive such compensation 177 as provided in § 30-19.12, and shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in 178 the performance of their duties as provided in § 2.2-2825. However, all such expenses shall be paid 179 from existing appropriations and funds provided to the Commission.

180 B. The North Carolina members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel 181 expenses as follows:

182 1. Ex officio legislative members who are members of the General Assembly at the rate established

- 183 in North Carolina G.S. 138-6;
- 184 2. Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or of local government agencies
  185 at the rate established in North Carolina G.S. 138-6; and
- **186** *3.* All other members at the rate established in North Carolina G.S. 138-5.
- 187 § 62.1-69.44. Annual report required.

188 The Commission shall submit an annual report, including any recommendations, to the Governor and189 General Assembly of Virginia and the Governor and General Assembly of North Carolina.

190 2. That the provisions of this act pertaining to the State of North Carolina, including its

191 participation in, funding for, and responsibilities to the Roanoke River Bi-State Commission, shall 192 become effective upon the date of enactment of a comparable act establishing the Roanoke River

193 Basin Bi-State Commission by the General Assembly of North Carolina.

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- 194 3. That, upon the effective date of this act, the Virginia Roanoke River Basin Advisory Committee195 shall organize and commence its work.
- 196 4. That, upon the decision of the General Assembly of North Carolina not to enact or to repeal
- 197 comparable legislation establishing the Roanoke River Bi-State Commission, the Virginia Roanoke
- 198 River Basin Advisory Committee shall assume the powers and duties of the Roanoke River Basin
- 199 Bi-State Commission, in accordance with § 62.1-69.39.
