That § 51.1-138 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 12 § 51.1-138. Benefits. 13 A. Employees who become members under this article and on whose behalf contributions are paid as 14 provided in this article shall be entitled to benefits under the retirement system. 15 B. By resolution legally adopted and approved by the Board, the employer may elect to provide and in the amount as the additional retirement allowance provided under subsection B of § 51.1-206. 33 C. Each employer providing the benefits of subsection B for its employees prior to July 1, 1990, 34 may elect to provide for the early retirement of employees as set forth in this subsection in lieu of the 35 early retirement and death before retirement provisions of the State Police Officers' Retirement System. 36 Such election must be made to the Board in writing prior to July 1, 1990. Any member in service on or 37 after his fifty-fifth birthday with five or more years of creditable service may retire upon written notification to the Board setting forth at what time the retirement is to become effective. The effective 38 39 date shall be after his last day of service but shall not be more than ninety days prior to the filing of

40 such notice. The member shall receive an allowance which shall be determined in the same manner as 41 for retirement at an employee's normal retirement with creditable service and average final compensation 42 being determined as of the date of his actual retirement. If the member has less than thirty years of service at retirement, the amount of the retirement allowance shall be reduced on an actuarial equivalent 43 44 basis for the period by which the actual retirement date precedes the earlier of (i) the member's normal 45 retirement date or (ii) the first date on or after the member's fifty-fifth birthday on which the member 46 would have completed a total of thirty years of creditable service.

47 Members retiring under the provisions of this subsection shall be entitled to receive post-retirement supplements as provided in § 51.1-166. In computing the amount of any supplement, any additional 48 49 allowances being paid under the provisions of subsection B of § 51.1-206 shall be disregarded. In the case of death before retirement, members whose employers elect to provide benefits in accordance with 50 51 the provisions of this subsection and who have not attained the age of fifty-five on the date of death 52 shall be assumed to be fifty-five years of age for the purposes of reducing the benefits on an actuarial 53 equivalent basis.

D. The retirement system shall not be liable for the payment of any retirement allowances or other 54 55 benefits on behalf of a member or beneficiary of a member for which reserves have not been previously created from funds contributed by the employer or the members for such benefits. 2. That the provisions of this act shall be applicable to persons retiring under the Virginia 56

16 benefits equivalent to those provided under the State Police Officers' Retirement System, as set out in Chapter 2 (§ 51.1-200 et seq.) of this title except for § 51.1-209, in lieu of the benefits that would 17 18 otherwise be provided hereunder for any employees who are employed in (i) law-enforcement positions comparably hazardous to that of a state police officer, including any sworn law-enforcement officer who 19 20 has the duty and obligation to enforce the penal and traffic laws of this Commonwealth as directed by 21 his superior officer, if so certified by his appointing authority, (ii) positions as full-time salaried fire 22 fighters, or (iii) positions as regional jail superintendents and jail officers of regional jail farms, regional 23 jails or jail authorities, as approved by the respective jail board or authority and by the participating 24 political subdivisions of such entities. Sheriffs of political subdivisions which participate in the 25 retirement system shall receive benefits equivalent to those of state police officers, except for the benefits provided under § 51.1-209, regardless of whether the employer has elected to provide equivalent 26 27 benefits as set out in this subsection. In addition, any person described in clause (i) of this subsection 28 who has been credited with twenty-five or more years of creditable service in the Retirement System may 29 retire under normal retirement, regardless of his age, with his retirement allowance computed as 30 described in subdivision A. 1. of § 51.1-155, and such person with twenty-five or more years of creditable service shall receive an additional retirement allowance under the same conditions and terms 31 32
