9 the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

10 WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was Ada Mason of Springfield, a civilian 11 employee of the close-knit Pentagon office that sustained heavier losses than any other; and

WHEREAS, Resource Services Washington, an Army office of budget analysts and accountants,
 most of them civilians, lost more than half of its employees on September 11, one of whom was Ada
 Mason; and

WHEREAS, a mainstay in the office for nearly two decades, Ada Mason was a vital part of thebudget section, which sustained losses of 24 out of 28 employees; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby18 note with great sadness the loss of Ada Mason, an innocent victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks19 on the United States; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for
 presentation to the family of Ada Mason as an expression of the heartfelt condolences of the General
 Assembly of Virginia.
