- WHEREAS, in 1932, the General Assembly gave Virginia motor vehicle inspectors the power to 6 7 enforce the Criminal Code of the Commonwealth as well as the Motor Vehicle Code; and
- 8 WHEREAS, these inspectors were later identified as troopers and became the Virginia Department of 9 State Police; and
- 10 WHEREAS, in 1932, the General Assembly established a system of motor vehicle safety inspections 11 that became a model for the nation; and
- WHEREAS, in 1932, the Virginia Department of State Police was issued its first fleet of 12 enforcement vehicles, including motorcycles and automobiles; and 13
- WHEREAS, the Virginia State Police is an organization that continues to do an outstanding job of 14 15 enforcing the motor vehicle laws of the Commonwealth and combating all aspects of crime in every part 16 of Virginia: and
- 17 WHEREAS, the Virginia State Police, as individuals, daily risk their lives in the performance of their 18 duties; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby congratulate the Virginia Department of State Police on its 70th anniversary and express appreciation, on 20 21 behalf of the citizens of Virginia, for its fine work; and, be it
- RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Colonel W. G. Massengill, superintendent of the Virginia State Police, in 22 23 24 commemoration of the 70th anniversary of this vital organization.
