5	management review of the Virginia Department of State Police.

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10	WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of State Police is assigned the responsibility to enforce criminal
11	laws of this Commonwealth and to conduct a highway patrol, a police training academy, a state police
12	radio communication system, the supervision of inspection stations and of inspectors of motor vehicles
13 14	and the general promotion of highway safety; and
14	WHEREAS, at the request of the Governor, the Attorney General, any sheriff, chief of police, attorney for the Commonwealth, or grand jury, the State Police is also required to conduct investigations
16	of potential criminal violations; and
17	WHEREAS, the ability of the State Police to perform these responsibilities is dependent on the
18	Department receiving and maintaining adequate human resources, training, equipment, and facilities; and
19	WHEREAS, it is vital to the public safety interests of the citizens of this Commonwealth that its
20	State Police force operate at its highest level of efficiency and effectiveness; and
21 22	WHEREAS, recently unmet critical needs have emerged within the Department in many areas of operation, including a shortage of state troopers;
$\frac{22}{23}$	WHEREAS, in order to adequately plan for and fulfill these critical needs in the future, it is
23 24	imperative that a comprehensive study be undertaken to review all functional areas of operation of the
25	State Police; now, therefore, be it
26	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
27	Review Commission be requested to conduct an organizational and management review of the Virginia
28	Department of State Police. The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall examine, but is
29	not limited to, the issues impacting manpower retention, compensation and retirement benefits, career
30	progression and training, and facilities and equipment adequacy. As part of this review, the Commission
31 32	shall also study the feasibility of identifying dedicated sources of funding to provide stability in supplying the resources needed by the Department of State Police.
32 33	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission for this study, upon
33 34	request.
35	The Commission shall complete its work by November 30, 2002, and shall submit its written
36	findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 2003 Session of the General Assembly as
