4. **Title** Higher Education 9(c) Bond Bill

5. **Summary/Purpose:** This bill authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds subject to the provisions of Article X, Section 9(c) of the Constitution of Virginia in an amount not to exceed \$149,505,400 plus financing costs for revenue -producing capital projects at institutions of higher education of the Commonwealth. The bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth and therefore constitute tax -supported debt. In addition, the bill includes an emergency clause and repeals Chapter 220 and 244 of the 2000 Acts of Assembly .

6. **No Fiscal Impact.** It is expected that the projects included in the bill will generate sufficient non-general fund revenues to pay operating expenses and debt service.

7. **Budget amendment necessary :** Yes. Capital authorization(s) and debt service have been included in the budget bill. The engrossed bill deletes one project for Virginia State University. Therefore, Item C -121 in House/Senate Bill 29 for Virginia State University should be omitted. In addition, the Central Appropriations language for the project reference in House Bill/Senate Bill 29 should also be omitted (Page 516, STRIKE lines 43 through 46.)

8. **Fiscal implications:** As currently written, capital financing will be provided for eleven new projects and nine carryover projects. Institutions will need non-general fund appropriations for debt service once the projects are complete. Institutions of higher education affected by the bill must set rates, fees, and/or charges at levels that will generate sufficient net revenues to retire the debt.
