**4. Title** Local telecommunication services.

**5. Summary/Purpose:**

This proposal allows a locality, electric commission or board, industrial development authority, or economic development authority in certain underserved areas to offer qualifying telecommunication services, or enter into public-private partnership to offer such qualifying telecommunication services. A "qualifying telecommunication service" is defined as a telecommunication service, which shall include but is not limited to, high-speed data service and Internet access service, of general application, which is not otherwise generally available competitively in the geographic area in which the service will be offered by an entity other than the county, city, town, electric commission or board, industrial development authority, or economic development authority. Such services may be provided only after approval by the State Corporation Commission.

**8. Fiscal implications:** There could be a small fiscal impact to the State Corporation Commission to review and approve the application requests. These costs can be absorbed within existing agency funding.
