5. Summary/Purpose:

The Department of Corrections and the Department of Juvenile Justice have a contract with a private telephone service provider to handle telephone calls made by in mates and juveniles in state correctional facilities. Under the provisions of the contract, in mates and juveniles may make collect calls to persons on an approved list. The rate charged the person receiving the collect calls approximately the same rate the provider charges for collect calls made by its regular, non-incarcerated customers. However, the surcharge on the calls could, in some instances, be higher for calls made by in mates and juveniles. 8. Fiscalimplications:

Therevenuecollected by the Department of Corrections and Department of Juvenile Justice from their inmate telephone contracts is deposited directly into the general fund. The projected revenue in FY2003 and FY2004 is included in the total revenue estimates for those years. If this legislation were enacted, the general fund revenue estimates would needed to be reduced by \$6.1 millioneachyear.

Thelegislation could also affect the revenues collected by local jails from similar contracts with telephone companies to provide service to jail prisoners. However, it is not known how many jails have such arrangements or the amount of revenue involved.
