**4. Title** Long-term care insurance.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** Requires that the Commission's regulation for Long -Term Care Insurance include standards for initial filings and rate increases that are similar to the standards in the model regulation recently developed by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. There is a second enactment clause in the bill that requires the SCC to amend the existing LTC regulation to implement the provisions of the bill by January 1, 2003. The third enactment clause provides that the bill is effective on January 1, 2003.
