- **5. Summary/Purpose:** ThislegislationwouldrequiretheBoardofNurs ingto:
  - Collect, store and make available aggregate nursing work force information in an electronic format.
  - Createanonlinenursingworkforceinformationwebsite
  - Implementanelectronicsystemforcertification,registration,andlicensure application,re newalandfeecollection.

Thisbillalsostrikesthelanguagerequiringappropriationoffundsfortheimplementationof theworkforceinformationsystem. Thehealthregulatoryboards and the Department of Health Professions are self -funded entities that are required to analyze their budgets at the end of every biennium and to revise their fees in the event their revenues are more or less than 10 percent of their expenditures. Thus, in 2004, this bill could result in a revision in the Board's feest ruc ture.

- **8. Fiscalimplications:** The Department of Health Profess ions (DHP) recently conducted a survey(perChapter587ofthe2000ActsoftheAssembly)tocollectdataonthe Commonwealth's nursing work force. The department reported that it cost \$80,000 to survey asamplepopulationof6,000nursesandnurseaides(t hereareapproximately150,000 licensedorcertifiedbyVirginia). Inadditiontodatacollection, these costs included the analysisandreportingofresults. Ifallnursesweretobesurveyed, as required by this legislation,thecostassociatedwithma ilingasurveyinstrumentisestimatedat\$51,000. Underthecurrentbill, response to the survey would be on -lineandwouldbevoluntarily,soit isdifficulttopredictwhattheresponsemightbe. Ifadditionalmailingswerenecessaryto increasethen umberofresponses, there would be additional costs. Thesubsequentanalysis and distribution of the data would likely be contracted. Although the agency has not received anestimate, itexpects the price contracting this activity to be at least \$80,000. thecostofthe originaleffort.

Inadditiontothecollectionandreportingoftheworkforcedata, the department would have additional expenses associated with establishing and maintaining an ursing workforce database. Assuming this database is an -going endeavor, the department estimates that the costs would be comparable to the existing physician profiling system, which costs approximately \$300,000 per year. This legislation would increase the regulatory fees charged to those practitioners regula ted by the Board of Nursing.
