8. Fiscalimplications: This billamends Standard 3 of the Standards of Quality regarding minimum staffing requirements. Guidance counselors would be required in elementary schools according to the following standards: (1) one hour perday per 100 students; (2) one full -time at 500 students; and (3) one hour perday additional time per 100 students or major fraction thereof. The provision of this bill regarding guidance counselors serves to codify requirements that are already outlined in the Board of Education's Standards of Accreditation. The current staffing standard for elementary schools require sguidance counselors or reading specialists.  In addition, elementary schools may employ one full -time reading specialist "at the discretion of the local school board. "Since it is not mandatory, there is no fiscal impact.
