4. Title Licensureandregulationofcertainfacilities

5. Summary/Purpose: This legislationrequirestheBoardandDepartmentofHealthtolicense asabortionclinicsanyfacility,otherthanahospitalasdefinedinthelaw,inwhichanysecond trimesterorfiveormorefirsttrimesterabortionspermonthareperformed.Eachfacilit yso licensedwillberequiredtocomplywithrequirementsrelatingtofacilitysafetyandpatient protection,includingcleanliness,sterilization,fireprotection,evacuation,staffcredentials, equipment,maintenanceoffacilitiesandequipment,allowab leprocedures,andfacility proceduresandpolicies.

8. Fiscalimplications: ThislegislationwouldamendtheCodetorequirethelicensing and onsiteinspectionofabortionfacilities.Thebill'sprovision scallforonsitelicensing inspectionsbytheVirginiaDepartmentofHealth(VDH)onatleastanannualbasisandthat complaintsagainstabortionfacilitieswouldbeinvestigatedbyVDH.

Promulgation of the necessary regulations by the Board of Health (BOH) would require coordination with the Department of Health Professions (DHP), to avoid unnecessary duplication with respect to the licensing and regulatory oversight that DHP currently provides for physicians ervices performed indoctor's offices. The inspections and complaint investigations conducted by VDH would also need to be coordinated with DHP.

Thereareapproximately14physicianclinicsandofficesprovidingabortionservicesin Virginia.Therearelikelytobemoreprovidersandfurtherstud ywouldbeneededtoarriveat amoreprecisenumbersubjecttotheprovisionsofthisbill(i.e.specificstatisticalreferences intermsofthenumberofabortionproceduresperformedinvarioustimeframes,etc.).Itis estimated there would be aminim umof 14 on site inspections to be conducted statewide, an indeterminable number of complaint investigations on abortion clinics, as well as a significant workload related to responding to public inquiries and requests for information. Because of the highly detailed and prescriptive nature of the bill, a full day may be necessary to determine a facility's compliance with all of the inspection requirements as well as significant pread post-inspection analysis and follow -up with the facility. VDH would als ohave to monitor the number of facilities that the seprovisions would apply to. A minimum of a half -time facility inspector is the expected impact for VDH to meet the requirements of this new inspection program considering all of the work load factors.

Basedonthecostofcurrentmedicalfacilityinspectors,thecostwouldbe\$34,250annually forapart -timeposition.Thisfigureincludestheassociatedsalary,aswellastheequipment, communications,supplies,andtravelcosts.Theone -timecostof\$ 2,000forpromulgatingthe regulationsisincludedintheestimateforFY2003.

Thebillauthorizesthecollectionoflicensingfeesfromabortionproviderstocoverthecosts of the licensing requirements in the bill. With 14 providers subject to licen sing and the first year costs estimated at \$36,250 the annual licensing fee would need to be approximately \$2,590 per provider to make the new programs elf -supporting (depending on the final determination of applicable facilities).
