5. Summary/Purpose:

Defines "medically induced infanticide" and classifies it as a Class 4 felony. The offense is defined as causing the death of a living fetus by deliberately and intentionally performing one of the procedures specified in the bill.

8. Fiscal implications:

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, this bill could result in a net increase in the number of persons incarcerated in state prisons. However, there is not sufficient data available for the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to determine the extent of any potential impact or the necessary appropriation under the provisions of the Code section.
