4. Title Juvenile detention; adults.

5. Summary/Purpose: This legislation proposes to amend §16.1-249 of the Code of Virginia to clarify that pre-dispositional detention of persons 18 years of age or older must be in an adult facility unless ordered for a violation of the terms and conditions of release from a juvenile correctional center, in which case the judge may order such detention in a juvenile facility.

8. Fiscal implications: The Department of Juvenile Justice advises that this bill will likely have no impact upon the agency as it only limits a judge's authority to hold the offender over eighteen years of age in a juvenile facility.
