Summary/Purpose: The bill would allow municipal solid waste landfills utilizing double synthetic liners systems that were permitted between December 21, 1988 and October 9, 1993 to continue to accept solid waste after 2020. Currently, no municipal solid waste landfills can continue to accept waste after 2020 in any disposal area not equipped with a liner system approved pursuant to a permit issued after October 9, 1993.
