- **5. Summary/Purpose:** The billamends § 32.1 127 of the Coderelating to require nursing homes provide to public health or community free clinic scertain unused drugs that will not be used by the residents for whom the drugs were dispensed. In addition, the bill adds § 54.1 3307.3 to the Coderequiring the Board of Pharmacyt oestablish procedures for the collection, handling and dispensing of those unused drugs, e.g., the identification of certain drugs, drugs shall be sealed in the original unopened tamper evident packaging, and be unexpired or within the recommended shelf if eof the drug. Nursing homes shall not be considered who less ale distributors as defined in § 54.1 3401 and shall not be required to obtain a license as required by Article 3 (§ 54.1 3435 et seq.) of Chapter 34 of Title 54.1 of the Code.

- 8. Fiscalimplications: The bill would require the Virginia Department of Health to promulgate regulationsrequiringnursingfacilitiestore -dispenseunuseddrugstopublichealtha communityfreeclinics.Inaddition,theBoardofPharmacywouldadoptregulationsforthe dispensing of such unused drugs by the public health or community free clinics. It is anticipatedthattheregulationscouldbepromulgatedas"non -discretionary"under§2.2 -4006.A.4.aoftheCodeallowingexemptiontotheAdministrativeProcessActifregulations arenecessitatedbychangesinVirginiaStatutorylaw.Whilethebillrequiresnonewstaff, thereisanegligiblecost(lessthan\$2,000foreachage ncy)ofregulatorypromulgationinstaff timefordevelopmentandprocessingoftheproposedregulation, i.e., preparing and writing of requireddocumentation, any notification and mailing sto interested parties of the regulatory action, and seeking requir edapprovals. Although this bill has a minimal fiscal impact for the affectedagencies, the cumulative consequence of several bills being enacted into law could requireabudgetamendment.
