The drugsmust be in the manufacturers' original sealed containersorsealed individual dose or unit dose package and the return must comply with federallaw.Onlyanauthorizedpersonwillaccomplishthephysicaltransfer, consentmustbe obtained from the relevant patient or his authorized representat iveforreturnofthe medication, the expiration date remains, all identifying data relating to the patient for whom thedrugwasdispensedmustberemoved, inventories must accompany the transferred drugs, bedestroyedaccordingtotheBoard's andoutdateddrugscannotbetransferredandmust regulations.
