Requires the Commonweal through plement the military payofany state employee ordered to active duty in the (i) armed forces of the United States, or (ii) in the organized reserve forces of any of the armed services of the United States or of the Virginia National Guard. The bill requires such supplement to be an amount equal to the difference between his military pay, including any allowances and the amount such individual would have earned as a state employeed uring such period of military service.

- $8. \ \ Fiscal implications: The rear eanumber of factors to consider regarding the possible impact of this bill however, the primary is suesto consider are as follows:$
 - Thefullcostofthestatesalaryforthe seindividualsisalreadyincludedinthebudgetsof thestateagencieswheretheyareemployed.
 - Ifanagencydoesnotneedtoback -fillallofthepositionsofemployeeswhoareactivated, thenthereshouldnotbeanimpactontheirbudget.
 - Infact,inso mecasestheremaybeasavingstotheagencyifthepositionisnotback becausetheagencywillonlyberequiredtopaytheincrementbetweenthestatepayand theactivedutypay(asopposedtopayingthefullcostofthestatepay.)
 - Therewillb eanimpacttothebudgetsofthoseagenciesthatoperateona24houraday,7 daysaweekschedule.Specifically,agenciessuchastheDepartmentofCorrections, DepartmentofJuvenileJustice,mentalhealthfacilities,mentalretardationfacilitiesand theStatePolicefallinthiscategory.(Theseagenciesreceivemostoftheirfundsfromthe GeneralFund.)

- Inthecaseoftheseagencieswith24 -7operations, therewill bear equirement to either bring innew employees or increase the level of overtime in order to back -fill the loss of those individuals or dered to active duty.
 - 1) Inthesecases, the amounts budgeted for positions of employees who are activated will most likely be required to back fill the position.
 - 2) Anysalaryincrementthattheseagencies willhavetopayactivatedemployeeswill beadirectimpactupontheirbudgets.

The combined cost to the seagencies (the amount that would have to be paid to activated employees) is estimated to be approximately \$1.3 million for a six month deployment or million for a year - long deployment. Since the agencies involved are primarily funded with general fund dollars, this impact would be mostly to the general fund.

Thenumberofstateemployeesapplicable(ReservistsorNationalGuardsmen)weredetermi ned bythenumberofstateemployeesthathaverecentlytakenmilitaryleave. Theaveragemilitary salarywasbaseduponthefollowing:

- -ReserveCommissionedOfficersmakeupapproximately25% of the applicable workforce.
- -Averageofficerpaywouldbea gradeofO -3(ArmyCaptain)with10yearsexperience.
- -AverageNCO/EnlistedpaywouldbeagradeE -5(Sergeant)with10yearsexperience.
- -6 per centin crease formilitary per sonnel recently passed by the U.S. Senate is enacted.
