4. Title Changeofinsuranceagentofrecord.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Thisbillamends §38.2 -1812 which is in effect until September 1,2002 and as it will be effective on September 1, 2002. The bill revises the section in the Agents Chapter that relates to the payment and sharing of commissions and provides that insurers must mapolicyholdertochangetheagentofrecordwithin acceptandhonoreachrequestfro 30 days unless the policyholder makes a written request to withdraw the change. The changeoftheagentofrecordwillnotbeeffectiveunlessthenewagentofrecordisduly appointed. The new agent must be paid all commissions paid for the policy beginning no later than the next anniversary date of the policy after the change. This does not include (i) vested life insurance commissions and (ii) commissions or other compensation payable under the ins urer's plan of retirement or deferred compensation with the agent. The request for changing the agent of record must be in writing and mustinclude the policyholder's name and address; insurer's name and address; policy agent of record; date of request; policyholder's number; name and address of the new signature and signature of acceptance by new agent. The bill does not require an insurer to appoint an agent of record, change existing contracts with an agent that provides direct compensation in lieu of c ommissions, or require payment of full commissionstoanewagentwhentheoriginalagentorcurrentagentcontinuestohave responsibilityforprocessingandothermattersregardingthepolicyholder.

Insurance has been informed that the Professional Insurance Agents agrees with the Bureau's recommendation, and has made this recommendation to Delegate Callahan.
