Summary/Purpose: Thisbilladdsresidentsofstatementalhealthormentalretardation facilities who have died to the list of those deaths that must be reported to the Medical Examiner of the locality in which the facility is located. A copy of the autopsymust be provided to the Commissioner of and Inspector General for Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services.

8. Fiscalimplications: Currently,deathsinDepartmentofMentalHealth,MentalRetard ation andSubstanceAbuseServices(DMHMRSAS)mentalhealthandmentalretardationfacilities are notreported to the Medical Examiner. However, if there is any suspicion of foul playor if the death is sudden, without a medical history that would explain the cause of death, deaths are reported to the Medical Examiner and to the State Police. The Inspector General for Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services and the Chief Medical Examiner have both recommended reporting any death in a statemental health or mental retardation facility to the Medical Examiner. It would then be the Medical Examiner's decision whether or not an autopsy is conducted.

AreviewofdataonannualDMHMRSAStotalfacilitydeathsforFY1999,FY2000andFY 2001indicatesthereareanaverageof92deathsperyear.BasedontheChiefMedical Examiner'sinformationforthenumberandcostforautopsiedandnon -autopsieddeaths,itwould cost\$111,850eachyeartocomplywithrequirementsofthislegislation. Thiscostisbasedonthe ChiefMedicalExaminer'sestimatethat60% or55deathsoutofanaverageof92totalfacility deathswouldrequireanautopsy,atafeeof\$2,000percase,resultingin\$110,000.Thisfee includesMedicalExaminercaseandscene fees,supplies,transportationandprofessionalcosts. Theremaining47% or37caseswouldnotrequireanautopsyandwouldcost\$50percaseor\$1,850.

These costs would be ongoing and it is anticipated that they can be absorbed within existing resources by the DMHMRSAS facilities.
