Fiscalimplications: Currently, deaths in Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Subs tance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS) mental health and mental retardation facilities are not reported to the Medical Examiner. However, if there is any suspicion of foul playorif the death is sudden, without a medical history that would explain the cause of death, deaths are reported to the Medical Examiner and to the State Police. The Inspector General for Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services and the Chief Medical Examiner have both recommended reporting any death in a statemental health or mental retardation facility to the Medical Examiner. Theremaining47%or37caseswouldnotrequireanautopsyandwouldcost\$50percaseor \$1,850.

Thesecostswouldbeongoing and it is anticipated that they can be absorbed within existing resources by the DMHM RSAS facilities.
