**5. Summary/Purpose:** Allows volunteers of any Virginia affiliate of Compeer to obtain, at no cost, personal criminal history records in connection with a person's application to become a Compeer volunteer.

**8. Fiscal implications:** According to the Department of State Police, this legislation would have minimal impact. With an estimated 60 volunteers belonging to Compeer throughout the Commonwealth having the \$15 fee per record check waived, this legislation would have a maximum impact of \$900 in lost revenue to the State Police each year. It should be noted that this calculation reflects the estimated worst case scenario (100 percent turnover of Compeer volunteers).
