Depending upon the outcome of the amendment effort and any legislation that may result,DMV mayrequireadditionalstaffinginordertoaccommodaterevisionsto,andnew requirements in, the application process, in which case this FIS will require revision. This legislationmayhaveanadverseimpactuponthechildspecialidentificationcardp rogramat DMV, if two proofs of residency are required of minors. DMV may no longer be able to issue this group of identification cards because children would not be able to prove residency and parentswouldnotbeabletocertifytotheresidencyofthe child. The loss of revenue received by DMV for issuance of child identification cards could be up to \$121,000 annually.
