4. Title Criminal records checks; private school employees.

5. Summary/Purpose: Expand the list of crimes for which criminal records must be searched for persons seeking employment in a private school by referencing those crimes to any offense set forth in §§ 63.1 - 198.1 or 63.1 - 248.7:2--barrier crimes for child welfare agencies, private child placing agencies, and juvenile residential facilities. Offenses to be searched for public school applicants are set forth as "a felony or a Class 1 misdemeanor or an equivalent offense in another state."

6. No Fiscal Impact.

8. Fiscal implications: According to the Department of State Police, the proposed legislation should not affect the volume of record checks being conducted by the Central Criminal Records Exchange because these checks for private schools are currently being performed under a different statute. There is not expected to be a change in the amount of revenue generated as the result of the proposed legislation since the number of record checks obtained by private schools is not expected to change.
