5. Summary/Purpose:

Thislegislationproposestoamendandreenact§§9.1 -101,9 -1.102,9.1- 110,9.1- 184,15.2-1737, and 19.2 - 13 of the Code of Virginia, and to add a section numbered 22.1-280.2:1. This bill defines a school resource of ficeras a trained, certified law -enforcementofficerhired byalocallaw -enforcementagencytoprovidelaw -enforcementandsecurityservicesto Virginiapublicelementaryandsecondaryschoolsanda schoolsecurityofficerasan individualwhoisemployedbythelocalschoolboardforthesingularpurposeofmaintaining orderanddiscipline, preventing crime, investigating violations of school board policies, and detainingandapprehendingpersonsvio latingthelaworschoolboardpoliciesonschool propertyoratschool -sponsoredeventsandwhoisresponsiblesolelyforensuringthesafety, security, and welfare of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors in the assigned school. The measurealsodi rectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices,inconsultationwiththe Department of Education and the Virginia State Crime Commission, to establish compulsory minimumstandardsforemploymentandjob -entryandin -servicetrainingcurriculaand certificationrequirements for schools ecurity of ficers; the training and certification will be administered by the Virginia Center for School Safety. School security of ficers are precluded fromappointmentasconservatorsofthepeaceandasspecialpoliceof ficers.Asecond enactmentclauseprovidesthatthetrainingandemploymentstandardswillbeapplicableto personsemployedasschoolsecurityofficersonandafterSeptember15,2003.

Fiscalimplications: ThelegislationdirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices (DCJS)todevelop,inconjunctionwiththeDepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaState CrimeCommission,thecompulsoryminimumstandardsforemployment,in -servicetraining andcertificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficersandchargestheVirginia Centerfor SchoolSafetywithadministeringtheapplicationofthosestandards.Thedepartmentadvises thatitwouldrequireapproximately\$300,000andtwoFTEtomeettherequirementsofthe

legislation, as the Virginia Center for School Safetyhas been largely unfunded since its inception.

The Department of Criminal Justice Services advises that it is important to note that it is aware that budget amendments for \$615,730 and three FTE for each year of the upcoming bien nium have been introduced to fully fund the Center. If those amendments pass, the agency will have sufficient resources to meet the requirements of this legislation and the other mandates of the Center.

TheDepartmentofEducationadvisesthatwhilethelegislationcallsforthedevelo pmentof standards,itstatesthatlocalschoolboardsmayhireschoolsecurityofficersandschool resourceofficersbutdoesnotcompelthemto,thereforethereisnofiscalimpact.
