5. Summary/Purpose: Thislegislation proposes to a mendandre enact§§9.1 -101,9- 1.102,9.1-110,9.1-184,15.2-1737,and19.2 -13oftheCodeofVirginia,andtoaddasectionnumbered 22.1-280.2:1. This bill defines a school resource of ficeras a trained, certified law -enforcementagencytoprovidelaw -enforcementand enforcementofficerhiredbyalocallaw securityservices to Virginia publicelementary and secondary schools and as choolse curity officerasanindividualwhoisemployedbythelocalschoolboardforthesingularpurposeof maintainingorderanddi scipline, preventing crime, investigating violations of school board policies, and detaining and apprehending persons violating the law or school board policies on schoolpropertyoratschool -sponsoredeventsandwhoisresponsiblesolelyforensuringthe safety, security, and welfare of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors in the assigned school. ThemeasurealsodirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices,inconsultationwiththe DepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaStateCrimeCommis sion, to establish compulsory minimumstandardsforemploymentandjob -entryandin -servicetrainingcurriculaand certificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficers; the training and certification will be administeredbytheVirginiaCenterforSchoo lSafety.Schoolsecurityofficersareprecluded from appointment as conservators of the peace and as special police of ficers. A second enactmentclauseprovidesthatthetrainingandemploymentstandardswillbeapplicableto personsemployedasschool securityofficersonandafterSeptember 15,2003.

Fiscalimplications: ThelegislationdirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices (DCJS)todevelop,inconjunctionwiththeDepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaState CrimeCommission,thecompulsoryminimumstandardsf oremployment,in -servicetraining andcertificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficersandchargestheVirginiaCenterfor SchoolSafetywithadministeringtheapplicationofthosestandards.Thedepartmentadvises thatitwouldrequireapproximat ely\$300,000and2FTEtomeettherequirementsofthe

legislation, as the Virginia Center for School Safety has been largely unfunded since its inception.

Inamendmentstothebudget,theSenateproposes\$150,000and2FTEpositionsingeneral fundsupp ortforthislegislation. TheHouseproposes3FTEpositionsandprovides the authority to use an additional\$300,000 from the School Resource Officer Incentive Grants Fund to support all of the activities of the Center. If the House's proposal is accept ed, it appears that the Center will be able to is sue fewer grants to localities, as it will have \$300,000 less in the Fund to award.

The Department of Education advises that while the legislation calls for the development of standards, it states that at local school boards may hire school security of ficers and school resource of ficers but does not compel them to, therefore there is no fiscal impact.
