5. Summary/Purpose: Thislegislationproposestoamendand reenact§§9.1 -101,9- 1.102,9.1-110,9.1-184,15.2-1737,and19.2 -13oftheCodeofVirginia,andtoaddasectionnumbered 22.1-280.2:1. This bill defines a school resource officer a satrained, certified law enforcementofficerhiredbyalocallaw -enforcementagencytoprovidelaw -enforcementand securityservicestoVirginiapublicelementaryandsecondaryschoolsandaschoolsecurity officerasanindividualwhoisemployedbythelocalschoolboardforthesingularpurposeof maintainingorderand discipline, preventing crime, investigating violations of school board policies, and detaining and apprehending persons violating the lawors chool board policies on schoolpropertyoratschool -sponsoredeventsandwhoisresponsiblesolelyforensuring the safety, security, and welfare of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors in the assigned school. ThemeasurealsodirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices, inconsultation with the DepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaStateCrimeCom mission,toestablishcompulsory minimumstandardsforemploymentandjob -entryandin -servicetrainingcurriculaand certificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficers;thetrainingandcertificationwillbe administeredbytheVirginiaCenterforSc hoolSafety.Schoolsecurityofficersareprecluded from appointment as conservators of the peace and asspecial police of ficers. A second enactmentclauseprovidesthatthetrainingandemploymentstandardswillbeapplicableto personsemployedasscho olsecurityofficersonandafterSeptember15,2003.

Fiscalimplications: ThelegislationdirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices (DCJS)todevelop,inconjunctionwiththeDepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaState CrimeCommission,thecompulsoryminimumstandardsforemployment,i n-servicetraining andcertificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficersandchargestheVirginiaCenterfor SchoolSafetywithadministeringtheapplicationofthosestandards.Thedepartmentadvises thatitwillrequireapproximately\$300,000and 2FTEtomeettherequirementsofthe

legislation, as the Virginia Center for School Safety has been largely unfunded since its inception.

TheGeneralAssemblyprovidedDCJSthreeFTEandtheauthoritytouseanadditional \$300,000fromtheexistingappr opriationfortheSchoolResourceOfficerIncentiveGrants FundtosupportalloftheactivitiesoftheCenter.ItappearsthattheCenterwillbeableto issuefewergrantstolocalities,asitwillhave\$300,000lessintheFundtoaward.

TheDe partmentofEducationadvisesthatwhilethelegislationcallsforthedevelopmentof standards, itstatesthatlocalschoolboardsmayhireschoolsecurityofficersandschool resourceofficersbutdoesnotcompelthemto, therefore there is no fiscal impact.
