4. Title Practice of pharmacy

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill would make changes in the Pharmacy Practice Act and the Drug Control Act to conform to current practice standards to remove restrictions on pharmacist practice to permitted pharmacies, to allow more uses of chart orders in prescribing, improve accountability in dispensing by allowing greater flexibility in record-keeping requirements, and improve efficiencies and reduce risk of diversion or adulteration of drugs by allowing certain alternate prescription delivery systems.

8. Fiscal implications: The agency estimates that it will cost approximately \$2,500 in the first year to promulgate the regulations required by this legislation. These costs are associated with the rule-making process and include expenses for committee meetings, public hearings, and mailings.
